# Eye Candy

Free Amigurumi Pattern by Peggygurumi

### **BASIC MATERIALS**

Yarn: Sport weight 100% cotton yarn in 3 colors-

- White
- Dark blue
- Light Blue

Embroidery thread: Red

Crochet Hook: 2.00 mm

Stitch Marker

Polyester Fiberfill

Sewing Pins

Tapestry Needle

Scissors

Safety eye: 8.00 mm (one)

### **SKILL LEVEL** Intermediate

# FINISHED DIMENSION 2.00 inches in diameter (approximately)

#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

The pattern is written in US Terminology.

MR: magic ring

chain: ch

Rnd: round

st: stitch(es)

sc: single crochet

inc: increase (2sc in same stitch)

dec: decrease (sc 2 stitches together)


b.l.o.: back loops only

slst: slip stitch

f.o.: finish off


#### **NOTE**

- 1. The eye is crocheted in closed rounds. So, before beginning each round, slst in the first stitch of the previous round and ch1. Begin the next round in the same stitch in which you made the slst.
- 2. The wrapper sides are worked in a spiral so using a stitch marker is advised.
- 3. Invisible color change: Before changing color of yarn from color A to color B, make the last single crochet with color A but finish the stitch with color B. Then continue with color B.









## **EYE**

### Start using Light Blue Yarn.

Rnd 1: MR, 6sc into MR =6st (Do not

close the MR too tight)

Rnd 2: incx6 = 12st

Rnd 3: (sc, inc)x6 = 18st



# Change to Dark Blue Yarn and cut the Light Blue Yarn.

Rnd 4: (2sc, inc)x6 = 24st

Insert a 8.00 mm safety eye through the center of the MR.

### Change to White Yarn and cut the Dark Blue Yarn.

Rnd 5: (sc, inc, 2sc)x6 = 30st

Rnd 6: (4sc, inc)x6 = 36st

Rnd 7: (sc, inc, 4sc)x6 = 42st

Rnd (8-15): 36sc for 8 rounds = 42st

Rnd 16: (4sc, dec, sc)x6 = 36st

Rnd 17: (4sc, dec)x6 = 30st

### Start stuffing with polyfill and stuff as you go.

Rnd 18: (2sc, dec, sc)x6 = 24st

Rnd 19: (2sc, dec)x6 = 18st

Rnd 20: (sc, dec)x6 = 12st

Rnd 21: decx6 = 6st

f.o. and leave a yarn tail. Using a tapestry needle, weave in through the front loops of all six stitches and pull to close. Hide the yarn tail inside your work.

### WRAPPER SIDES [MAKE 2 USING WHITE YARN]

### Leave a long starting yarn.

Rnd 1: MR, 6sc into MR =6st

Rnd 2: incx6 = 12st


Rnd 3: b.l.o. 12sc = 12st

Rnd 4: (sc, inc)x6 = 18st

Rnd 5: 18sc = 18st

Rnd 6: (sc, inc)x9 = 27st

Rnd 7: incx27 = 54st



### Change to Light Blue Yarn.

Rnd 8: (slst, ch1)x27 = 54st

f.o. and weave in the yarn tail.

### **ASSEMBLY**

- 1. Sew the wrapper sides on both sides of the eye along the back loops of Rnd 2, over Rnd 10-12 of the eye.
- 2. Using Red embroidery thread, embroider branching veins over the eyes from the back towards the front of the eye over Rnd 8 -21.
