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BOOK/DEVICE SLEEVE PATTERN

SKILL

Advanced Beginner

GAUGE (BLOCKED)

Gauge not important.
5 rnds = 4.5"x4.5"
(11.5cmx11.5cm) in double
crochet stitch with 4mm
crochet hook. *Refer to
diagram on page 5.

MEASUREMENTS

SQUARE: 12" X 12" (30.5CM X 30.5CM)
AFTER BLOCKING

FINAL SLEEVE SIZE: 8.25" X 6.25"
(20.9CM X 15.88CM)

SPECIAL STITCHES AND TECHNIQUE

- Puff stitch (pf)

Yo, insert hook into space, pull up a long loop, there is 3 loops on the hook, yo, insert hook into same space, pull up a long loop, there is now 5 loops on the hook, yo, insert hook into same space, pull up a long loop, there is now 7 loops on the hook, yo, insert hook into same space, pull up a long loop, there is now 9 loops on the hook, yo, pull through 8 loops on the hook, yo, pull through the remain loops on the hook to make the puff.



9 loops on hook



yo, pull through
8 loops



yo, pull through
last 2 loops

- Mattress stitch join

MATERIALS

- Any #3 dk weight yarn or your preferred choice
- Crochet hook recommended by yarn or your preferred choice
- Scissors
- Stitch markers
- Tapestry Needle
- 1 Button
- Blocking material (optional)

GENERAL NOTES

- Ch3 at beginning of row, COUNTS as a double crochet stitch.
- Ch4 at beginning of round, COUNTS as double crochet stitch and chain 1.
- You will be working in rounds so do NOT turn your work at end of rounds.
- You will be making a square, then sew to join and form the sleeve and finally attach a button for closure.
- You can increase/decrease square in 2 different ways: on the continuous granny square section at the beginning or the size of the square itself in the crossed stitch section. More information in pattern instructions.
- The information inside brackets () is all stitches to make in one stitch or space, mentioned in pattern.
- The numbers in front of stitches does also indicate the amount of those same stitches referred to make in one stitch or space.
- The information inside square brackets [] refers to repeated pattern in the round mentioned.

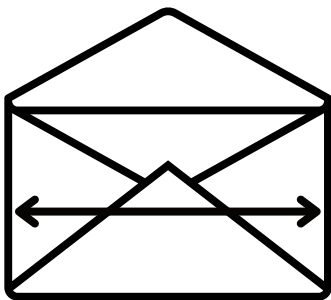
HOW TO TAKE MEASUREMENTS FOR YOUR SLEEVE



M1



M2



M3

M1: Measure the length of book/device and take a note.

M2: Measure the thickness of book/device and take a note.

Your square size will be the M1 and M2 together while folded forming the sleeve.

M3: $M1 + M2 =$ size of sleeve from side to side.

Note: If you are blocking your square be careful this measurement will stretch and consequently becoming bigger. This means if you are blocking your square then just use M1.

Use M1 only if your yarn is stretchy or you are blocking the square.

My own measurements (inches):



M1= 7.75"



M2: 0.5"



M3: 8.25"

$M1 + M2 = 8.25"$
(After blocking)
I used M1 for my square size, side by side while folded as in picture.

PATTERN

Part 1: continuous granny square section

Make a mc. (refer to diagram on next page)

- Rnd 1: Ch 3, (2dc, ch2, 3dc, ch2, 3dc, ch2, 3dc, ch2) into mc, join with slst to top of beg ch 3, slst until corner ch2 sp. -3 sts in each side
- Rnd 2: Ch3, (dc, ch2, 2dc) in corner sp, dc in next 3sts, *(2dc, ch2, 2dc) in corner sp, dc in next 3sts*, rep from * to *until end, join with slst to top of beg ch3, slst until corner ch2 sp. -7sts in each side
- Rnd 3: Ch3, (dc, ch2, 2dc) in corner sp, dc in next 7sts, *(2dc, ch2, 2dc) in corner sp, dc in next 7sts*, rep from * to *until end, join with slst to top of beg ch3, slst until corner ch2 sp. -11sts in each side
- Rnd 4-7: Rep previous rnd. You will have 4sts extra at each side, increasing in corners (2dc, ch2, 2dc) so: rnd 4: 15sts each side...rnd 5: 19sts each side...

You may choose to increase (or not) your square in this section by making more rounds but make sure to finish with a round that has a multiple of 3 each side.

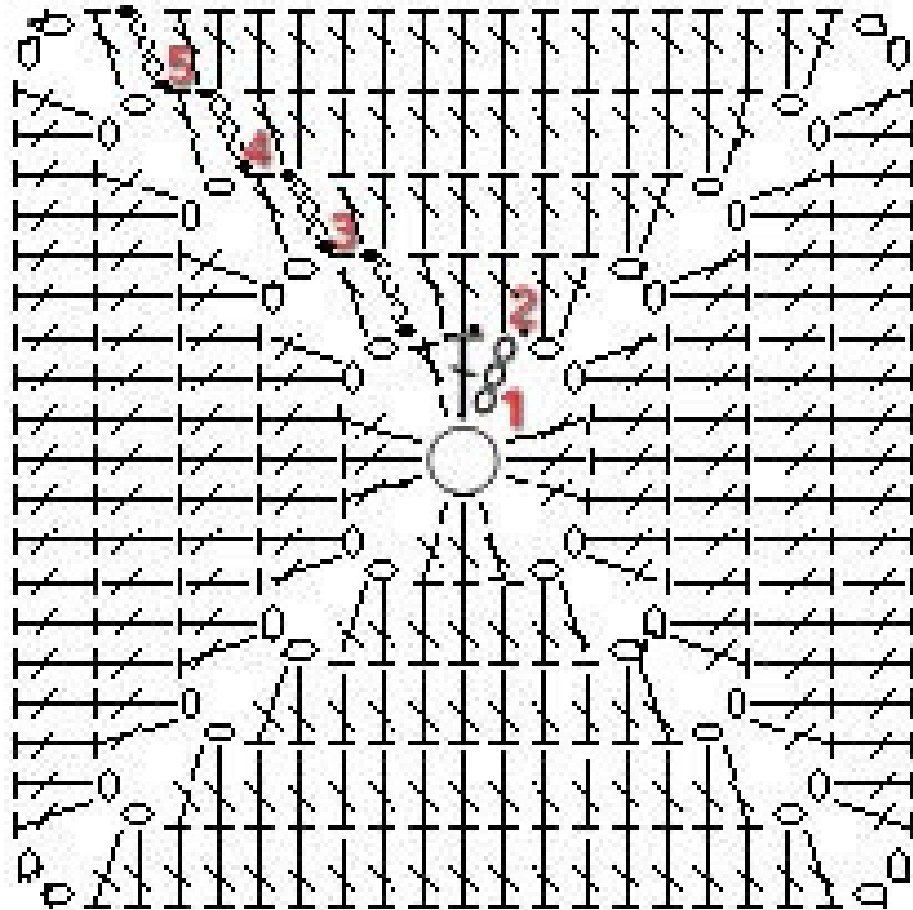
- Example round 7 has 27sts each side (where I stopped) so 27 is a multiple of 3 but round 8 will have 31sts each side which 31 isn't a multiple of 3. You will have a multiple of 3 every 4 rounds.

You are able to increase square afterwards as well to fit your book/device. You can change colours in any round.

PATTERN CONTINUATION

Part 2: crossed dc and puff section (diagram on page 10)

- Rnd 1: Ch4, (pf, ch2, pf, ch1, dc) in corner sp, [**sk2, dc in next st, dc on previous 2 sk sts through the back***, rep from *to* until corner, (dc, ch1, pf, ch2, pf, ch1, dc) in corner sp], rep from [to] until before last corner, join with slst to top of 3rd ch from beg of rnd, slst until corner ch2 sp.- 29sts each side or multiple of 3+2

Crossed dc as in bold letters in rnd 1 above:



Sk2, dc next st



Dc on previous 2 skipped sts
through the back to front



- Rnd 2: Ch4, (pf, ch2, pf, ch1, dc) in corner ch2 sp, sk next pf, [dc in ch1 sp, dc in next 29sts (or your previous end of rnd st count) until ch1 sp, dc in ch1 sp, sk next pf, (dc, ch1, pf, ch2, pf, ch1, dc) in corner ch2 sp, sk next pf], rep from [to] until end, join with slst to top of 3rd ch from beg of rnd, slst until corner ch2 sp. - 33sts each side or multiple of 3

PATTERN CONTINUATION

Part 2: crossed dc and puff section

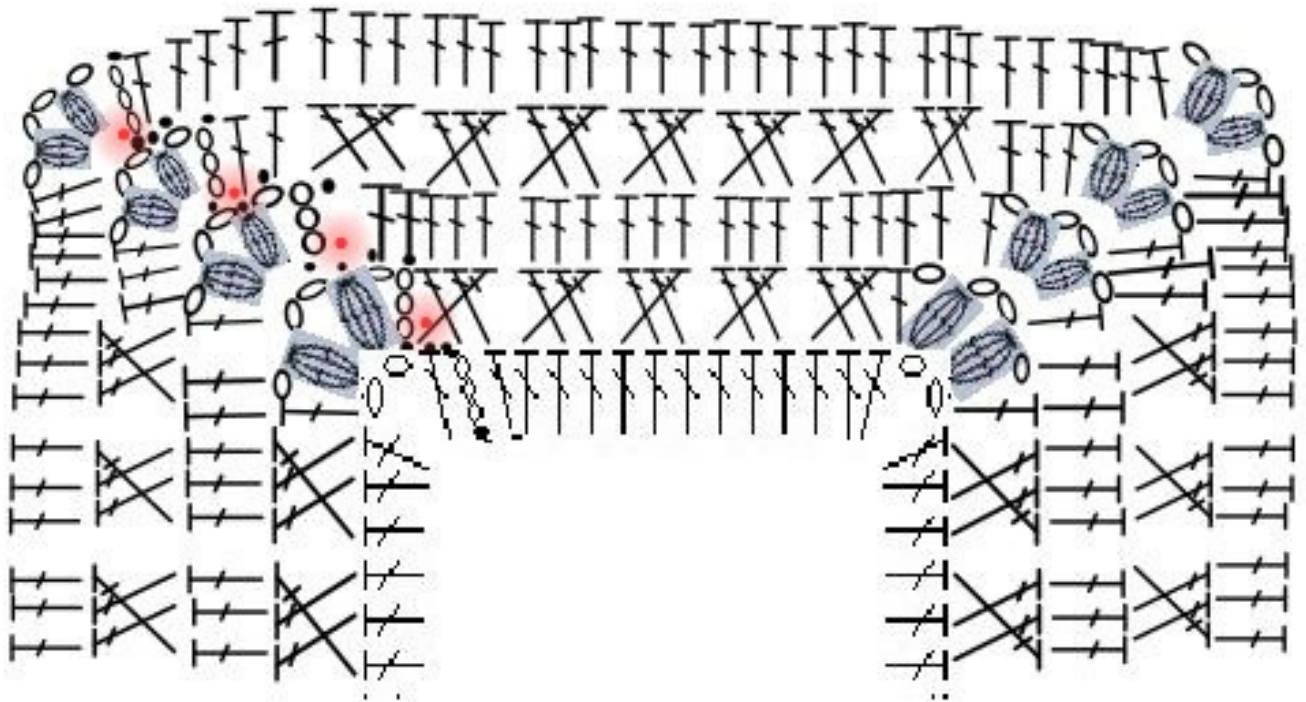
- **Rnd 3:** Ch4, (pf, ch2, pf, ch1, dc) in corner ch2 sp, dc in next pf, dc in next ch1 sp, *sk2, dc in next st, dc on previous 2 sk sts through the back*, rep from *to* until ch1 sp before corner, [dc in ch1 sp, dc in next pf, (dc, ch1, pf, ch2, pf, ch1, dc) in corner sp, dc in next pf, dc in next ch1 sp, *sk2, dc in next st, dc on previous 2 sk sts through the back*, rep from *to* until ch1 sp before corner], rep from [to], dc in ch1 sp, dc in next pf, join with slst to top of 3rd ch from beg of rnd, slst until corner ch2 sp. - 39sts each side or multiple of 3
- **Rnd 4:** Ch4, (pf, ch2, pf, ch1, dc) in corner ch2 sp, dc in next pf, dc in ch1 sp, [dc in next 39sts (or your previous end of rnd st count) until ch1 sp, dc in ch1 sp, dc in next pf, (dc, ch1, pf, ch2, pf, ch1, dc) in corner ch2 sp, dc in next pf, dc in next ch1 sp, dc in next dc], rep from [to] until end, join with slst to top of 3rd ch from beg of rnd, slst until corner ch2 sp. - 45sts each side or multiple of 3
- **Rnd 5-6:** Rep rnd 3-4 or keep repeating rnds until you have reached your desired square size.
- Fasten off , cut yarn, weave in ends.

Each repeat of rnds 3 and 4 will have an increase of 6 stitches in each side of square.

DIAGRAM

CROSSED DC SECTION WITH PUFF STITCH

Please note this is sample diagram. Refer to written pattern for row instructions. The red dot is the start of rounds.



● slip stitch (slst)

○ magic circle (mc)

⌗ crossed dc

⌚ double crochet (dc)

○ chain stitch (ch)

⊖ puff stitch (pf)

TEST FIT JOINING/CLOSURE



Turn square from wrong side facing you and fold as shown in picture above. You can use stitch markers if you need to help you. You will see the right side is now facing you. Test if your book/device fits the sleeve before joining. If it's still small add more rounds finishing always with a repeat of round 4.

Using the mattress stitch join (see special stitches and techniques section) sew from direction show by arrows.



Attached a button for closure.
Your sleeve is now completed!
