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Data

Size: 17in high x 16in wide Skill Level: Intermediate Technique: Classic

Abbreviations

ch: chain
slst: slip stitch
sc: single crochet
trc: treble crochet
flo: front loop only
** repeat between asterisks
(): total stitches in a round or row

Gauge


23 stitches x 28 rows = 4in x 4in (in sc)


Materials

3.0 mm crochet hook
100 grs. beige fingering yarn
100 grs. white fingering yarn
150 grs. fingering pearl gray yarn
stitch marker
tapestry needle
scissors

Steps

1. Crochet 100ch with beige yarn. Beginning in the second ch from the hook, work sc. In the last ch, make 4sc. Continue crocheting 97sc on the back of the chain. In the ch of the first sc worked, make another 2sc. You have made a 201 stitch oval. Guide yourself with the Round 1 Chart. (201)





- 2. Crochet 16 rows (approx. 2.5in) of sc in a spiral. Remember to place a stitch marker in the first stitch of the round. When finished, close and cut thread. (201)
- 3. Switch to white yarn and crochet a row of Seawall Stitch. For that, make a false trc (or 4ch), 1ch, 1trc in the first stitch. Skip two stitches. *Crochet 1trc, 1ch, 1trc in the same stitch, skip 2 stitches*. Repeat 55 times from *to*. When finished, join with a slst. Cut thread. Guide yourself by the Seawall Stitch Chart. (201)



- 4. Switch to gray yarn and crochet 3sc together in each space formed by the chains. Look at the Seawall Stitch Chart for clearance. Then crochet in a spiral another 7 rounds (approx. 1.2in) in sc. Remember to place a stitch marker in the first stitch of the round. Close and cut thread. (201)
- 5. Repeat interspersed: 8 times step 3, and 7 times step 4 of the pattern. (201)
- 6. Crochet with beige yarn step 4 of the pattern. (201)



- 7. Let's crochet the handles. To do this, first flatten the fabric to fold it in two. You will clearly see the front and the back of the sack. Place a stitch marker on the first stitch to your right. From now on, that will become the first stitch of the rounds.
- 8. Crochet: 20sc, 100ch, skip 60 stitches, 41sc, 100ch, skip 60 stitches, 20sc. (281)
- 9. Continue crocheting in a spiral 7 rounds in sc. (281)
- 10. Crochet slst flo around the inside and outside edge of the handle.
- 11. Close, hide threads, block and enjoy.
